ntroducing a special rose for our July / August magazine!

It will be a rose that you have never seen in people's gardens before and we have two growing very vigorously in pots in our garden. They have been named:- RNLI With Courage Rose celebrating 200 years of the RNLI last year at Chelsea Flower Show. We received them as bare root floribunda roses in November and after potting them they have exploded in growth this spring time. Just one stem head had 19 buds on it! They have a nice perfume to them too.

Now some news about two churches.

he first about St Andrew's Church, in Compton Dundon, Somerset who with great rejoicing from the local community and beyond have had their church bells

reinstated and ringing after over 100 years. Villagers raised £160,000, enabling the bells to be reinstalled and brought back to life again. The Bell Appeal Committee Group had been fundraising since 2019 and raised the money through a variety of sponsored events and applications for grant funding.

Paul Kemp-King writes in an unpublished manuscript that it is almost certain that there was once a bell foundry in the village where the bells for the church were cast, although its exact location is uncertain. Bells cast in Compton Dundon can also be found in nearby villages too.

Somerset architect Mark Taylor, designed the new fixtures in the bell tower. The project saw five of the church's bells restored while two others were acquired from former churches in Lancashire and Sussex. The two oldest, from 1630 and 1668, were originally cast in the village by Robert Austen's local bell foundry family.

Judy Skelding, chair of the Bell Appeal Committee, said "People have been so supportive and have enjoyed the fact we are restoring part of the village tradition. We've had a lovely response from people who have never rung bells in the village and are now learning to do so." And our news about one other church's resolve in solving a maintenance problem with the graveyard.

oats keeping the churchyard tidy.

Bruce Sinclair from a Local Democracy Reporting Service reported on 4th June this year that goats have been introduced as an eco-friendly way of keeping a churchyard in shape.

Narberth Town Council in Pembrokeshire is trialling using the animals at St Andrew's Church to clear excess growth around gravestones and across the site.

The goats come from a business, believed to be the only one of its type in the UK, which provides the service for the council as well as for a national park and other local churches.

The goats are kept in their designated areas using GPS satellite technology.

Visitors are being asked to support the scheme by avoiding the grazing goats at work, making sure children are supervised and kept away from them, and by keeping dogs on leads.

It is hoped the goats can be used as a natural and chemical-free method of managing overgrown areas and for controlling brambles and invasive vegetation.

"Daily welfare checks will be carried out on them to ensure they are healthy, safe, and well cared for throughout their time on site," the town council said. The goats themselves come from Clynderwen-based

Mr. White, said: "We're the only company in the UK to do this. We get enquiries from all over the UK, but the travel costs can make it unviable for the customers from further away. We enjoy what we do and meet some nice people along the way."

The council said in a statement: "Narberth Town Council is continuing its work to enhance the grounds of St Andrew's Church as part of our ongoing biodiversity and environmental improvement programme. "These goats will help clear excess growth around gravestones and across the site, enabling us to implement a longer-term ground management plan."


